EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this agenda item is to provide council with the results from community survey; feedback from the non-profit focus groups; follow up information requested by council members including a recent history and current city non-profit support, potential federal funding for projects on the unfunded list, and information about potential return on investment for projects on the unfunded list.

In addition, as part of the presentation, the Financial Strategy Committee (FSC) will provide recommendations for council deliberation of potential ballot item language specifically regarding the term of the tax, proposed uses to be contained in the ballot language – specific projects and project categories, the percentage of revenue that would be dedicated to non-profit community projects and a related debt question.

COMMUNITY SUSTAINABILITY ASSESSMENTS AND IMPACTS

- **Economic** - The proposed tax renewal would not raise the current level of city sales and use tax. The revenue collected would provide funds for capital projects

that can help the economic vitality of the city and address infrastructure and facility maintenance of city assets. The proposed debt authorization would be repaid by the proposed tax renewal and would not raise the current level of city sales and use tax. Due to significant competition for contractors, capital project costs have been increasing significantly faster than the overall rate of inflation. Debt authorization provides flexibility to accelerate construction schedules, which can result in significant cost savings.

- **Environmental** - New capital construction inevitably results in use of materials and increased energy expenditure. At the same time, many of the projects would include efficient and effective enhancements to infrastructure, or support functions and organizations which would help address specific environmental goals of the city.
- **Social** - Several of the projects that would or may be funded with the tax renewal build community infrastructure, enhance gathering and recreation spaces, serve low-income and underserved populations, and provide opportunities for everyone to enjoy the uniqueness and quality of life in Boulder.

OTHER IMPACTS

- **Fiscal** - The renewal would extend an existing 0.3 percent sales and use tax, not increase taxes. Three-tenths percent sales and use tax rate for the City of Boulder results in thirty cents tax on a one-hundred-dollar purchase.
- **Staff time** - The staff time needed to complete the background work for ballot items is included within the departmental work plans.

BOARD AND COMMISSION FEEDBACK

PRAB Feedback:

At the [May 24, 2021 PRAB meeting](#), the PRAB reviewed the 2022-27 Capital Improvement Program. At the meeting, PRAB was informed the city was considering a renewal of the CCS Tax and staff was participating in city-wide discussions about projects, with three projects in consideration for the tax renewal. PRAB was provided access to the [May 25th City Council Study Session](#). While there was not a formal vote, the PRAB was supportive of the three projects (Boulder Creek Corridor Investments, Boulder Parks for All, and Reimagining Recreation) staff had submitted to the City Council Financial Strategy Committee (FSC). The PRAB minutes reflect overall support for “Taking Care of What We Have”, appreciation for prioritizing the Boulder Creek Corridor based on the multi-functionality of the corridor and high visitation, and overall support for the projects submitted by staff to the FSC.

PUBLIC FEEDBACK

Community Survey

Magellan Strategies released an online community survey that was available online from June 14 through June 27. In addition, they conducted a telephone survey from June 28 through June 30. The survey asked the community for their input on: 1) the renewal of the tax; 2) the term of the tax 3) the percentage of the tax allocated to community non-profits; 4) support for specific city capital projects and project categories; and 5) support for a related debt issuance to fund more projects upfront to avoid project cost escalation.

A memo from Magellan Strategies, the topline and crosstabs survey results, and demographics are contained in Attachment A.

Community non-profit focus groups:

During late June to mid-July, staff conducted two sets of community non-profit focus groups. Group one heard from previous grant recipients – those that received funding through the Community, Culture and Safety (CCS) tax (CCS1 and CCS2) and group two heard from the broader non-profit community. A summary of the feedback from those sessions is contained in Attachment B.

BACKGROUND

A full background of city capital funding was provided in the [agenda memo for the February 9, 2021 study session](#). Over time, the capital investment strategy has proved successful in addressing portions of the city's unfunded capital needs, including a capital bond in 2011, the passage of the Community, Culture and Safety Tax in 2014 and 2017 and the creation of a General Fund supported dedicated Governmental Capital Fund with \$6 million in annual funding that began in 2018. However, there still exists an estimated \$295 million in unfunded needs across departments that require attention.

At the February 9, 2021 study session, council gave guidance for the Financial Strategy Committee (FSC) to serve as the committee to narrow the project list to be tested in a community survey. The FSC did not select final projects for funding. The FSC in coordination with staff:

1. Selected and engaged a survey consultant to gauge community support for a tax extension ballot item specifically regarding the following elements:
 - a. Potential uses (specific city projects and project categories).
 - b. Term/length of the tax.
 - c. Portion of tax proceeds that would be dedicated to community non-profit projects through a grant program.
 - d. A related debt authorization ballot question.
2. Developed criteria and select a subset of specific city capital infrastructure projects and project categories to be included in the survey for testing.
3. Based upon results of the community survey, will provide a recommendation to council for the ballot language, particularly related to items 1(a)-(d) above that will be included in the presentation to council on July 20.

At the [May 25, 2021 study session](#), staff presented potential ballot items including the potential renewal of the .03 percent sales and use tax. At the [June 22, 2021 study session](#), staff presented the unfunded capital needs and departments were available to answer questions from council regarding specific projects on the unfunded needs list.

ANALYSIS

At the June 22, 2021 study session, council requested the following information be provided in addition to the survey results and the feedback from the non-profit focus groups:

City support for non-profit organizations.

Council requested that staff compile a summary of current city support for community non-profits. That summary table for the years 2017-2022 commitments is contained in Attachment C.

Potential American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding opportunities for projects on the unfunded list.

The 2021 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) is a \$1.9 trillion package that provides direct support of individuals and families, businesses, and a variety of other activities to support recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, including funding of local governments to aid in the recovery. The City of Boulder is receiving approximately \$20.15 million as a part of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds in two allocations, approximately \$10 million in June/July 2021 and the second \$10 million in June/July 2022. Cities have wide ability to utilize the funds to aid the organization and community in recovery.

The U.S. Treasury Department has released interim guidance to cities as to the eligible uses of local recovery funds and staff has begun the process of identifying needs, qualifying uses, and opportunities to leverage other sources of funding with regional governments and other entities. To address Council's request to review unfunded capital needs and potential Community, Culture, and Safety Tax projects for eligibility under local recovery ARPA funds, staff is providing additional information related to the guidance to date, the potential eligibility, and the process for determining the appropriate uses of the ARPA local recovery allocation.

ARPA specifies capital investment eligibility in narrower terms than other provisions within the bill. ARPA allows local recovery funds to be utilized for capital investment in three specific areas: water, sewer, and broadband. Investments in water and sewer projects are broadly eligible under ARPA, with an emphasis on projects that address impacts of climate change. Investments in broadband must be specific to providing access to areas without service or improving internet speeds up to a certain minimum level. Broadband projects can be broader so long as the main intent is improving internet access. For example, one unfunded need is to bring fiber to traffic signals across the city.

This project could be funded under ARPA if it is within a larger Fiber Phase 2 project to improve access throughout underserved areas.

General infrastructure projects are not eligible under ARPA unless it is directly responding to the public health emergency or the economic impact of the pandemic. Under current federal guidance, there are narrow areas of opportunity in capital investments within certain qualifying geographic areas and amongst populations that have encountered disproportional impact due to the pandemic. For example, investments in affordable housing are likely an eligible expense.

Treasury utilizes Qualified Census Tracts (QCTs) under the Department of Housing and Urban Development to identify underserved areas eligible for broader uses of ARPA funds. Portions of central and southern Boulder are within a QCT and would qualify for general infrastructure investment with ARPA funds that address social determinates of health, or housing, educational, and neighborhood disparities. Staff is sensitive to disproportionate impact of the pandemic felt in populations in other areas of the city and will utilize the racial equity instrument to help determine broader infrastructure and service enhancements.

In general, staff is preparing a process to determine ARPA eligible projects on the premise that the uses are one-time in nature. While ARPA allows for funds to be committed through 2024, the city is receiving local recovery funding as a one-time cash infusion and thus, staff will focus efforts on recommending items that are one-time in nature. Council will receive more information on the initial funding needs, recommended uses of ARPA, and the longer-term process on engagement and leveraging of local recovery funds at the August 17 Council Meeting as a part of a special budget adjustment item.

Potential other state and federal funding opportunities for projects on the unfunded needs list.

Council request that staff provide information regarding what projects on the unfunded list might be eligible for funding through other state and federal grants that are allocated through the Denver Area Council of Governments (DRCOG). The Transportation and Mobility department indicated that none of the transportation related projects on the unfunded list would be eligible for other federal dollars because they are maintenance capital projects which cannot be funded by federal and state grants. “Routine” roadway maintenance is largely considered a function that is both undertaken and funded locally. Federal and state grant dollars for infrastructure are primarily allocated for significant reconstruction or new construction projects.

Potential return on investment (ROI) identified for projects on the unfunded needs list.

Departments provided some analyses/comment regarding projects and potential return on investment which is included in Attachment D – Department responses regarding project return on investment.

Boulder Fire Rescue unfunded needs supporting responses

At the June 22 study session, council had questions regarding Boulder Fire Rescue's unfunded needs, Attachment E provides supporting responses.

QUESTIONS FOR COUNCIL

Staff questions are for input on the draft ballot language to be brought to council for consideration at the August 3 regular meeting.

1. Does council support a 10-year or 15-year tax extension?
2. Does council support the portion of tax proceeds that would be dedicated to a community non-profit grant pool to be 10%, 15% or 20%?
3. What specific city capital infrastructure projects would council like to be included in the ballot language?
4. Would council like to include the four project categories (*Safe and Prepared Boulder, Transportation System Resilience, Active and Healthy Boulder, Customer Service Modernization*) used in the community survey as the description of the types of projects to which future funding allocations could be allocated.
5. Does council support a related 10-year or 15-year debt authorization question?

This document summarizes a bi-lingual survey of 1,911 registered voters in the City of Boulder, Colorado. The interviews were conducted from June 16th to 30th, 2021. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 2.21% at the 95% confidence interval. The survey data were weighted to represent the City of Boulder voter turnout demographics for an odd-year election. Survey Objectives

The primary objective of this survey was to measure voter support and opposition levels for an up to 15-year extension of a 0.3% sales tax and up a \$110 million bond measure to fund city infrastructure and non-profit community projects. The survey also measured voter opinion of the importance of different infrastructure project categories.

Key Findings

- Boulder voters overwhelmingly support a 15-year extension of a 0.3% sales tax to fund infrastructure and non-profit community projects. Among all respondents, 73% would vote yes and approve this ballot measure, 20% would oppose it, and 7% were undecided.
- Voter support for a \$110 million bond measure to help accelerate funding of infrastructure and non-profit community projects is also strong. Among all respondents, 64% would vote yes and approve this ballot measure, 23% would oppose it, and 13% of voters are undecided.
- The infrastructure project with the strongest level of voter support was the improvement of the city's vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian flow to reduce greenhouse gas emissions (79% more likely to support ballot measures).
- Other infrastructure projects that garnered strong voter support included the reclaiming of the Boulder Creek Path corridor (77% more likely to support), the

relocation and construction of Fire Stations #2 and #4 (72% more likely to support), and the expansion of Fire Station #3 (69% more likely to support).

- The survey measured the importance of five different “infrastructure categories.” The most important categories in order were Transportation System Resilience (81% extremely or very important), Progress Towards Climate Goals (71%), Safe and Prepared Boulder (70%), Active and Healthy Boulder (46%), and Customer Service Modernization (40%). A complete description of these categories is included in this memorandum.
- The survey measured the change in voter support if the percentage of the sales tax revenue going towards non-profit community projects increased to 15% or 20% from 10%. Among all respondents, 29% were more likely to support the sales tax ballot measure if it was raised to 15%, and 25% if it was raised to 20%. Among voters that were undecided on the uninformed ballot test, 15% to 20% were more likely to support the sales tax extension.

Uninformed 0.3% Sales Tax Extension Ballot Test

Boulder voters overwhelmingly support a 15-year extension of a 0.3% sales tax to fund infrastructure and non-community projects. Among all respondents, 73% would vote yes and approve the ballot measure, only 20% would vote no and reject it, and 7% were undecided.

“This year, the city is considering a ballot measure to extend the 0.3% sales tax to fund infrastructure and non-profit community projects for up to 15 years. This would generate about \$200 million in revenue, with 90% of the funds going toward city infrastructure projects and 10% going towards non-profit community projects. If there was a ballot measure this November to extend the 0.3% sales tax for up to 15 years, would you vote yes to approve it, or would you vote no and reject it?”

Uninformed \$110 Million Bond Measure Ballot Test

Voter support for a \$110 million bond measure in addition to the 0.3% sales tax extension is also strong with 64% of respondents saying they would approve a bond measure, 23% would oppose it, and 13% were undecided.

“In addition to extending the 0.3% sales tax, the city is considering another ballot measure asking voters to approve up to a \$110 million bond measure to help accelerate funding of



infrastructure and non-profit community projects. The revenue from the 0.3% sales tax would be used to pay off the \$110 million bond.

If there was up to a \$110 million bond measure to help accelerate funding of infrastructure and non-profit community projects, would you vote yes to approve it, or would you vote no and reject it?"

Voter Support and Opposition for Infrastructure Projects

After uninformed sales and bond measure ballot questions were asked, respondents read “information questions” regarding infrastructure projects that may be funded by the ballot measures and the reasons why the city is considering them. After reading each question, respondents were asked if they were more likely to approve or reject the ballot measures. The following tables rank the information questions by the percentage of respondents who are more likely to approve the ballot measures.

Annual road maintenance, multi-modal paths, critically deteriorated signal poles, and the replacement of the Central Avenue Bridge. These upgrades will improve the condition of Boulder's transportation system, reduce greenhouse gas emissions by improving vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian flow and improve safety for all users for a cost of \$17 million.	79%	13%	8%

Informed 0.3% Sales Tax Extension Ballot Test

After being informed of the infrastructure projects that the ballot measures may fund, respondents were asked again if they would approve or reject the sales tax extension and bond ballot measures. Compared to the uninformed sales tax extension ballot measure, there was very little change with 74% of voters saying they would approve the ballot measure, 21% would reject it, and 5% were undecided. However, among Hispanic respondents, support increased by 9 points to 65%, opposition decreased by 1 point to 30%, and undecided voters declined by 8 points to just 6%.

Uninformed \$110 Million Bond Measure Ballot Test

Like the sales tax extension informed ballot test, there was very little change in voter support and opposition levels for the \$110 million bond measure. Voter approval for the bond measure increases by 1 point to 65%, opposition declined by 2 points to 21%, and the undecided percentage increases by 1 point to 14%.

Voter Importance Ratings for Infrastructure Projects

The survey measured voter opinion of the importance of five different descriptions of infrastructure projects. The following table ranks the infrastructure descriptions by the percentage of voters that said it was extremely or very important.

Conclusion

This voter opinion survey finds overwhelming voter support for a 15-year extension of a 0.3% sales tax and a \$110 million bond measure to fund city infrastructure and non-profit community projects. Voter support is strong for both ballot measures because they believe these infrastructure projects are needed and essential to maintaining Boulder's quality of life.

Many voters also believe the cost of the 15-year sales tax extension is affordable, and they are receiving a good value in return. The survey indicates both ballot measures should achieve voter approval this November as long as voters are generally informed of how the funding would be spent.

Survey Methodology

This survey was conducted by sending an MMS text message to approximately 28,000 residents in the city of Boulder, CO, and by live dialing both landline and cell phone sample for live telephone survey responses. Data collection also included sending an email to the city's email list and promoting it through the city's social media platforms. The survey response data was weighted to reflect the voter turnout demographics for an odd-year



election in Boulder, CO. The interviews were conducted from June 16th - 30th, 2021. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 2.21% at the 95 percent confidence interval.

CCS Renewal Nonprofit Focus Groups

Summary of Comments

Background

City staff hosted four meetings with representatives of the Boulder nonprofit community between June 23 and July 12. One final meeting is scheduled for July 15. In total ten participants, representing ten different organizations attended the meetings. Attendees included representatives from: Studio Arts Boulder (CCS2 Grantee), Dairy Center for the Arts (CCS1 Grantee), BMOCA (CCS2 Grantee), Resource Central (CCS2 Grantee), KGNU (CCS2 Grantee), Growing up Boulder, Boulder Arts Commission, I Have a Dream Foundation, Community Cycles (CCS2 Grantee), Butterfly Effect Theatre of Colorado, El Centro AMISTAD, The Catamounts, Social Venture Partners Boulder County, JLF Colorado, Junkyard Social Club, TGTHR, EcoArts. Frequent Flyers Aerial Dance. Staff shared the study session memorandums and study session summaries as background and presented a brief slide show with background information and the current concept for the 2021 CCS renewal. Major themes are summarized below.

1. Not having identified nonprofit projects on the ballot could result in reduced support for the ballot item.

While all participants agreed that CCS is an important source of capital funding for Boulder nonprofits, many suggested that the lack of identified project could be a risk. Participants involved in the 2017 ballot item referenced the coordinated campaign run by the organizations and expressed concern that the nonprofit community may not muster the same energy to pass the bill if organizations are not listed on the ballot.

On the other hand, some mentioned the Boulder County Worthy Cause program, which is regularly supported by voters and does not identify grant recipients ahead of time. Some participants recommended that highlighting past grant recipients could help voters visualize the types of projects that could receive funding in future rounds.

There was near unanimous support for the highest allocation possible for nonprofit projects out of the tax funds (e.g. 15% to 20%).

2. General support for planning grants with some reservations.

Most participants supported the concept of planning grants to help nonprofits develop ideas into actionable plans and projects. A few respondents noted that planning grants could help promote equity in the program, as they could assist groups that address the diverse needs of the community be prepared to seek capital grants in later rounds.

However, some participants highlighted the importance of financial and organizational capacity to the success of a capital campaign and capital project and suggested that the ability to raise funds to fund feasibility plans would be a key indicator of organizational readiness for a capital

project. Several participants recommended that the amount of funds for planning grants be limited so that “transformational” capital investments can be made.

3. Transformational investments versus small capital projects. Regarding allocation of funds, competing themes emerged about the types of capital projects community groups desired. On one hand, many participants described a desire for large-scale “transformational” projects, such as community arts centers or community and cultural hubs that could host several complimentary nonprofit organizations and provide a breadth of services to the community. On the other hand, other participants expressed a desire for smaller capital projects (i.e. \$10k to \$50k) to fund repairs and improvements to existing facilities.
4. Use consistent naming and definitions when discussing the tax. During conversations about the tax, several participants asked about the rationale for changing the name from Community, Culture and Safety Tax to Community Resilience and Safety Tax. Several participants were concerned about omitting the word “Culture”, as it conveys a broad sense of creating a diverse, welcoming community as well as supporting the arts. Participants also recommended that if the word “Resilience” is used, that the city define what it means in the context of the ballot item and in a way that is consistent with how the broader community uses the term.
5. Considerations for program award and administration. Many participants asked questions about the structure of the program and decision-making structure for awards. While staff explained that the program has not been designed yet, several considerations were raised:
 - a. Representation matters in the selection committee – any body used to make award decisions should include representation from the diverse communities within Boulder to ensure that the process is equitable.
 - b. Clearly communicate expectations up-front – ensure that community groups have a clear understanding of the time and effort involved in applying for a grant, including areas of evaluation (such as financial and organizational capacity). Many respondents recommended having a less rigorous process for smaller capital and/or planning grants.
 - c. Perform a needs assessment – several individuals recommended doing community outreach to determine the community’s highest needs and to survey the financial health of the nonprofit community. To incorporate an equity lens, participants recommended using cultural brokers and other community connectors to ensure that underrepresented communities’ voices are included during the planning process.
 - d. Be clear on the decision-making process – many respondents encouraged staff and council to be clear on the decision-making process and the authority of any committee to make awards. Some groups expressed frustration with the 2017 renewal process, as there was a perception that recommendations made by the stakeholder committee were changed during council deliberations.
 - e. Support grantees’ success – staff received several comments regarding structuring grants and support to support the success of nonprofits. Suggestions included looking at the grant milestones to make it easier for organizations to draw funds as they are needed during the design and construction process; allowing a portion of funds to

support operational costs during construction; and allowing donated land and other in-kind costs to count as matching funds.

- f. Allocate funds for program administration – several participants recommended ensuring that the ballot language provides funding related to the administration of a new grant program (staffing, committees, etc.). Some respondents recommended that council clarify that other grant programs at the city (e.g. Arts Commission Grant Program, Health Equity Fund).

One final focus group is scheduled for Thursday, July 15. Staff will provide an update during the Tuesday, July 20 study session if any new themes emerge.

City of Boulder Non-Profit Support

2018-2022

Multiple City departments provide both direct and in-kind support for our local non-profits. Since 2018 the average amount of direct financial support for city non-profits was approximately \$8.9 million. Notable examples include Housing and Human Services (HHS) which alone averages \$4.2 million a year. This \$4.2 million excludes affordable housing related funding activities that can run in the tens of millions per year (including carryover). Facilities and Asset Management grants subsidized rent worth nearly \$1.8 million each year to the Dairy Arts Center and Boulder Museum of Contemporary Art. Of the \$49.3 million in cumulative financial support funded or committed through 2022 only \$7.9 million, 16% is directly related to the Community, Culture and Safety Tax II as a stand-alone funding mechanism.

Along with direct financial support, the city supports non-profits with in-kind support which includes below market rate rents for Studio Arts Boulder and the Harbeck House as well as storage space for Historic Boulder and use of OSMP meeting facilities for the Colorado Native Plant Society.

The tables below provide a summarized view of city non-profit support by both Type and Department. Additional line item detail can be provided upon request.

Facilities & Fleet Department:

Alpine-Balsam Site Horizontal Infrastructure

The 2015 purchase of the Alpine-Balsam property, formerly the Boulder Community Health (BCH) Broadway campus, was a strategic investment for the community. The adoption of the Alpine-Balsam Area Plan in 2019 confirmed the vision for the property to be redeveloped, in alignment with community goals, as a mixed-use community hub for affordable housing and the city's western hub. However, the Alpine-Balsam site is partially located in the 100-year floodplain. As a result, it is necessary to build infrastructure that removes the site from the floodplain to allow for the residential construction and Pavilion renovation to be designed without floodproofing constraints. The city hired engineering firm Anderson Consulting Engineers in 2020 to perform an alternatives analysis to identify the most feasible design options to meet the criteria of the area plan and technical requirements.

The analysis concluded that an open-channel greenway that is approximately 60-feet in width and traverses the southern edge of Balsam Avenue would be the preferred design that fully removes the site from the floodplain. The design's inlet (how it directs water into the channel on the western edge of 9th Street) may require some construction under 9th Street and on the edge of North Boulder Park, though the consultant is still evaluating the engineering feasibility of this option. The inlet will not interfere with the operation or use of North Boulder Park and will be coordinated with Parks & Recreation staff to ensure alignment and community engagement. The design is aligned with the Goose Creek Master Plan (in progress) and the Alpine-Balsam Area Plan.

The next step in 2021 is to finalize the design details and complete the conditional letter of map revision (CLOMR) process through FEMA, which is the federal permitting process that allows for construction to occur.

The intention is to align the exterior hospital deconstruction with the construction of the flood mitigation channel, which would take advantage of construction efficiencies and potentially utilize soils removed from the channel to assist in filling the hole and grading the site where the hospital was located. Should these efficiencies occur, flood mitigation construction could begin in 2022.

In addition to flood mitigation, there is additional horizontal infrastructure work that needs to be performed, including energy infrastructure, construction of some or all roads, pedestrian connections, and utilities construction. Preliminary estimates have suggested this work will cost \$3.6 million, bringing the total site development (horizontal infrastructure plus flood mitigation) to \$6.6M.

ROI Impacts

It is not possible to establish an ROI of only the horizontal infrastructure and flood mitigation work because benefits are only realized when understood within the wider context of the Alpine-Balsam development. Completion of the horizontal infrastructure and flood mitigation is a necessary phase towards developing the Alpine-Balsam site and the consolidation of 13 city buildings into a single campus. Consolidation of such non-geographically constrained buildings brings operational efficiencies due to the construction of a new energy efficient building built to last for 70-100+ years, but also due to a decrease in total square footage.

The buildings planned to be consolidated into a Western Hub at the Alpine-Balsam site averaged \$9.39 per square foot for Operation and Maintenance in 2019, over a total footprint of 166,016 square feet. This includes costs for custodial services, energy (electricity and gas), and minor (non-capital) maintenance.

Data from the General Services Administration (GSA) demonstrate that new high-performance buildings average an operational cost of about \$5.33 per square foot annually. These operational savings, coupled with a decrease in total facility square footage after consolidation, demonstrate a significant return on investment after consolidation is completed.

In addition to operational expenses, consolidation brings about capital renewal savings, as it is less expensive to perform capital maintenance on one campus rather than 13 separate buildings.

There are also unquantifiable benefits that are difficult to assign a dollar amount, such as strides made in reaching the city's climate goals, and having buildings that meet the city's core values and fulfill functionality requirements.

Deferred Capital Renewal Needs (Backlog)

Overview

Buildings supported by the Facilities Department have an estimated maintenance backlog of about \$15.3 million. These capital renewal needs include like-for-like replacements of mechanical equipment such as boilers and rooftop condensing units as well as upgrades to fire suppression systems, roof replacements and other necessary major maintenance.

It is preferential to be proactive rather than reactive when maintaining the city's building portfolio. Deferred Capital Renewal represents building systems whose lifecycles have been extended beyond their typical duty cycle, causing breakdowns and malfunctions to become more common. By continuing to defer such capital maintenance, the following may occur:

- Increased downtime and disruptions for essential systems, such as elevators, air conditioning, etc.
- Reduced reliability of systems and assets
- Further accelerated deterioration of some assets requiring earlier renewal
- Increased costs from reactive/crisis planning, unnecessary repairs, and shortened service lives

ROI Impacts

The cost associated with replacing aging building systems is inevitable; the city can extend system lifecycles by a few years, but eventually the condition of a deteriorating system will pose critical safety and functionality issues. Unless a facility is disposed from the city's portfolio, the unfunded liability will need to be addressed at some point, and waiting until a critical failure occurs could result in very expensive corrective measures being taken. The Facilities Master Plan (FMP) will detail a framework for assessing whether particular buildings should be considered for consolidation.

Facilities cannot assign a dollar "cost" related to the further deferral of maintenance. Building system failures and disruptions are difficult to anticipate, and their negative impacts extend beyond the need to perform emergency maintenance, as they include inconveniences and liabilities. Cost savings to some

degree are anticipated as fewer breakdowns occur from aging equipment, but are difficult to estimate and are dependent on how the city chooses to prioritize deferred maintenance across its building portfolio. The Facilities Master Plan will offer such a rubric for prioritization.

Furthermore, it is likely that in order to meet the city's climate goals, system replacements may not be "like-for-like", but rather be replaced with more energy efficient, and thus more costly, components. Deferred capital renewal needs do not account for system upgrades, but rather only like-for-like replacements.

Parks & Recreation Department:

Boulder Creek Improvements

The Boulder Creek Path, #6 on Tripadvisor's "Best Things to Do in Boulder," is popular with residents and visitors alike. Its proximity to the downtown core contributes to the economic vibrance of the area and provides an important car-free transportation artery through the city. Bikers, runners, walkers, and more all would benefit in their pursuit of healthy activity and transportation, and renovations and updated management plans would protect and enhance the creek's environmental wellbeing. **Direct ROI:** N/A. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, conservation and resiliency, property values, economic development, and visitor spending.

Boulder's Recreation Centers and Indoor Pools Improvements / Recreation Facility Capital Maintenance

Improvements to the three recreation centers and their pools would increase visitation, allowing further investment in other recreation facilities and programs and overall community health. If enhancements brought traffic up 20% from 2019 levels, the facilities would generate an additional \$500,000 annually to directly reinvest in recreation offerings. Along with new expanded financial aid from Parks & Recreation, this would enhance equity across all ages, races, and incomes in the Boulder community. **Direct ROI:** ~\$500,000 annually. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, property values, and visitor spending.

Boulder Reservoir and Coot Lake Recreation and Ecological Enhancements

Improvements to the Reservoir and its surrounding natural areas would enhance both paid and free recreational experiences for residents, workers, and visitors. Increased visitation would also provide \$90,000 to sustain operations and pay for environmental protection of the area and our city's water supply. The area supports all manner of healthy activities including boating, biking, jogging, walking, as well as threatened species. **Direct ROI:** ~\$90,000 annually. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, conservation and resiliency, and visitor spending.

Boulder Civic Area Phase 2 Development

Like the Boulder Creek Path, the Civic Area is central to Boulder's economic and cultural core, supporting property values, economic activity, and appeal for visitors. This development on the eastern end of the area, which hosts the Farmer's Market and other events, would encourage further activation of the space through increased events and strengthen the community fabric and support local artists and producers. These events generate some revenues from

sponsorship and agreements; however, the largest driver would be increased economic activity from attendees. **Direct ROI:** ~\$25,000 annually. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, conservation and resiliency, property values, economic development, and visitor spending.

East Mapleton Ballfields Redevelopment

As community tastes have shifted, the space at East Mapleton Ballfields has been underutilized. It is centrally located adjacent to the thriving Boulder Junction area, and its redevelopment would allow for new healthy activity and increase property values as the area grows. The site would be adapted based on community preferences and priorities. Additional ballfield rentals could be programmed, which would be expected to generate at least \$50,000 a year in revenue which offsets direct expenses from programming the fields. **Direct ROI:** ~\$50,000 annually. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, and property values.

Sports Complexes and General Athletic Field Improvements / Athletic Field Capital Enhancements

Boulder maintains premier sports facilities as well as fields and courts throughout the city, providing healthy activities and enhanced livability and property values in numerous neighborhoods. Improvement of these facilities would encourage more league play and the associated social and health benefits, as well as the ability to accommodate activities that best match the public interest. **Direct ROI:** ~\$100,000 annually. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, economic development, and visitor spending.

Historical and Cultural Facility Preservation

Boulder is known for its unique culture, history, and beauty. Protecting and activating historical spaces would enhance visitor spending, property values, and its particular sense of place. Community input would be sought to align the use of these spaces with the greatest cultural and economic benefit.

Neighborhood and Community Park Capital Enhancements

Funding for maintenance and enhancement for neighborhood and community parks would bring health, environmental conservation, and economic benefits to every corner of the city. This would maximize the use of Boulder's diverse inventory of parkland to engage community members of all backgrounds. **Direct ROI:** N/A. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, conservation and resiliency, and property values.

Valmont City Park Phase II

Valmont City Park boasts a spectacular bike park and disc golf course, providing unique recreational opportunities that draw visitors from across the region. Phase II would continue to develop this community benefit space with accessible activities for all community members and allow for additional activation through races, camps, tournaments, and other events that generate revenue for the city and the Boulder business community. **Direct ROI:** N/A. **Indirect ROI:** community health and wellness, conservation and resiliency, property values, economic development, and visitor spending.

Pearl Street Mall Refresh (coordinate w/ CV)

In collaboration with Community Vitality, this project would enhance the crown jewel of the downtown Boulder business community. Revitalizing this unique pedestrian mall would directly contribute to economic vibrance and encourage spending by visitors and community members

alike. **Direct ROI:** N/A. **Indirect ROI:** property values, economic development, and visitor spending.

Police Department:

Public Safety Building Expansion

Public Safety Building Expansion and Renovation. Construct a 25,000 square-foot expansion for Police functions, along with associated renovations to the existing facility. The renovation would focus on net zero, generating its required energy from an on-site solar system. This will provide many opportunities to leverage financial incentives such as rebates, production incentives for the solar system, or even tax credits (captured by a partner with tax liability and passed through to the city). These financial incentives can cover as much as 50% of the incremental cost that is required to go above the minimum energy code requirements. If building is truly net zero, could save approximately \$105K per year in gas and electric costs.


Transportation & Mobility Department:



The proposed Smart Street project will deploy real-time Automated Traffic Signal Performance Measures (ATSPMs) modernizing our traffic signal management

by providing high-resolution data to support performance-based maintenance and operations strategies that improve safety and efficiency while cutting congestion and cost. The project will allow the city to leverage our Federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Grant. The project would complete the remaining traffic signals on the city's regional transportation network not funded by our DRCOG federal grant. This would be 41 intersections and require \$1.45M. Our ultimate objective is to deploy the new enhanced system city-wide. This would require upgrading the remaining 48 traffic signals not on the regional network and \$1.70M additional funding. Delaying the project ten years would cost an additional \$1.1 Million. Delaying the project would also mean connecting to the broadband outside of broadband construction, this delay would cost an additional \$1M.

Based on our EPA-based modeling the Smart Street project will reduce greenhouse gas production by approximately 5,600 metric tons annually. The EPA estimates 2020 societal cost was \$42/MTCO₂ increasing to \$69/MTCO₂ in 2030. Early deployment of the project will have the multiplying effect that early deployment will provide additional years of benefit and reduce the escalating long-term challenge. Deployment in the first year (2022) of the CCS extension will save approximately \$265,000/year in greenhouse gas societal cost escalating to \$383,000/year in 2030. The completion of the Smart Street project will also further the city's goal of 15-minute neighborhoods for pedestrians in and around Boulder.




Resilience Classification: Essential

The proposed Deferred Maintenance includes \$3-\$6M on 27-54 lane miles of pavement management. The City of Boulder's priorities for transportation funding are the safety and preservation of the transportation system, including maintaining all streets in a good and safe condition. The Transportation & Mobility Department has established a Pavement Management Program (PMP) for Boulder's 300-mile street system, which includes inspecting and rating all streets on a three-year interval to maintain awareness of existing conditions and guide where pavement repairs will be made in future years. The purpose of the Pavement Management Program is to provide the optimal level of funding, timing, and renewal strategies that will keep the citywide street pavement network at or above a "Good" OCI rating. The best strategy may be to defer a costly reconstruction on one street in order to complete less expensive treatments on other streets to minimize its deterioration into a more costly type of treatment, such as reconstruction. Street treatments that may take place under this program include mill/overlay, chip-seal, and crack-fill/seal.

The project is not eligible for other federal dollars because they are maintenance capital projects which cannot be funded by federal and state grants. "Routine" roadway maintenance is largely considered a function that is both undertaken and funded locally. Federal and state grant dollars for infrastructure are primarily allocated for significant reconstruction or new construction projects.

In recent years the cost for repair and reconstruction has increased over 5% per year. Delaying this essential project could cost the city an additional \$3.3M and at the same time decrease safety and quality of life for the citizens of Boulder. This is an essential infrastructure investment, and it will be done in coming years. The timing on this is imperative to save from future construction cost increases which outpace regular inflation and allow the city to meet goals for overall pavement condition levels at the lowest possible cost. As seen in the graph below, the goal is to perform pavement maintenance as early in the life cycle as possible using rejuvenating agents, crack seal treatment and chip seal treatment,

which add years to the pavement service life at the lowest possible cost. Waiting to provide maintenance increases costs by orders of magnitude as service life deteriorates rapidly beyond 10 years without maintenance. The city has approximately 66 centerline miles (out of approximately 300 total) that have a OCI level of 59 or below (the goal is 75 or above) and many of these streets could be improved with lower cost treatments while some will require higher cost treatment such as mill/overlay and reconstruction. Over a 25 year period, the yearly cost to mill/overlay one mile of roadway and then perform low-cost early maintenance such as crack seal averages \$23,530, whereas a reconstruction with no maintenance averages \$60,000. The Return on Investment for providing lower cost maintenance and treatments is 155%, demonstrating the value that early maintenance provides for Boulder taxpayers and residents.



Supporting Response to CCS Tax Renewal – Unfunded Capital Needs – Boulder Fire-Rescue

Immediate

[**Fire Station 3 Relocation Funding Gap**](#)

Replacing the current, outdated Fire Station 3 with a near Net Zero, modern and efficient facility will significantly cut down operational and facility maintenance costs inherent in an aging, outdated building. The new Fire Station 3 will also serve as a co-located facility for Fire Administration Headquarters, alleviating the need for separate, administrative real estate at premium Boulder prices. BFR has analyzed the reduction in overall construction costs to not include Admin HQ space; this is estimated to be approximately \$1.5M. In contrast, BFR was occupying approximately \$250,000 worth of office space per year at Center Green.

Intermediate

Land cost continues to quickly escalate in Boulder. BFR wishes to move forward with land identification and purchase now to offset future escalation.

[**Fire Station 4 Relocation**](#)

Long Term

ALS will allow BFR to eventually capture revenue for patient transport. The 911 market in Boulder has a particularly robust rate of payment success, and revenue from transport in the future will be able to offset program expenses. However, it should be noted that the BFR Master Plan focus for ALS is centered on patient outcomes. ALS will give Boulder an opportunity to address many patient metrics, with prioritized focus related to an increase in pre-hospitalization cardiac survival.

Fire – Capital Maintenance and Completion of Phases II and III at Fire Training Center

Due to the high rate of usage of the Driving Pad and Burn Building, this maintenance expense is expected to be necessary in 10-15 years, if not before. Completion of Phases II and III will allow for additional classroom space as well as dormitory space, thus offering the opportunity for longer-term training. Fees for training classes as well as dormitory space will assist in recovering the costs of the buildout, which has occurred in other local municipalities. Expenses are also likely to be in partnership with Boulder County.
