EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The proposal to install front railings at 745 Highland Ave., an individual landmark and contributing property in the Mapleton Hill Historic District approved (5-0), at the Landmarks Board April 6, 2022 meeting.

The decision was based upon the board's consideration that the proposal meets the Standards for Issuance of a Landmark Alteration Certificate in Chapter 9-11-18, B.R.C. 1981.

The board's approval is subject to a 14-day call-up period by City Council, no later than **April 19, 2022**.






Figure 6. Details of proposed railing components.




Figure 7. East elevation
